**STATUTES OF
THE GREEK GUIDING ASSOCIATION (SHO)**

**CHAPTER A
GENERAL PROVISIONS**

Article 1

Name & registered office

An independent Association of private law and non-profit was established under the name The Greek Girl Guides Association, which is renamed to The Greek Guiding Association. The registered office of the Association is in Athens.

SHO is a member of the World Association of Girl Guides & Girl Scouts (WAGGGS).

Article 2

Purpose and Means

1.Purpose: to contribute to the shaping of the personality of the children and the young girls and boys, to become responsible and sensitive citizens, to help create a better world.

2.Means: the purpose is achieved with modern educational and creative programmes based on the axes: Personal Development, Social Participation and Life in Nature.

Special Organisation and By-laws, prepared and amended each time by the National Board, will arrange every detail in relation to the achievement of the above purpose. The Organisation and the By-laws, provided they do not contradict this Constitution and the Laws of the State, are requisite for the members of SHO.

CHAPTER B
PROPERTIES OF THE ASSOCIATION-MEMBERS

Article 3

**Properties of the Association-Members: Categories-Admission-
Rights-Resignation**

1.The Greek Guiding Association is a non-profit Association of educational, community and cultural profile. The Members of the Greek Guiding Association are regular members, due to the capacity within the Greek Guiding Association and members «in term of office».

2.Regular members: The regular Members are voted upon a written proposal of three Members of SHO, by the National Board and the Applications Committee at a common meeting under the chairmanship of the Chairman of the National Board. The absolute majority of all the members of the National Board and the Applications Committee is required for the voting. The elected Members may not be more than 10, unless a special authorisation is given by the National Assembly.

SHO's members voted as members of the World Council or of the European Board of WAGGGS become automatically regular Members of the National Assembly.

3.Members due to capacity: The Members, due to their capacity within SHO, are the Branch Commissioners and the District Commissioners of SHO, if they are already regular Members.

The Members, due to their capacity, are Members for as long as their capacity is in effect, and they withdraw automatically as soon as this expires. By exception, the Members voted as members of the National Board of SHO become automatically regular Members as soon as they are elected members in the National Board.

4.Members «in term of office»:

I. Active members of SHO that are not Regular Members or Members due to capacity are voted as members of the National Assembly of SHO for a term of 2 years from the following categories:

- a. Chiefs qualified and commissioned.
- b. Chiefs holders of a Diploma of Camper and commissioned.
- c. Chiefs commissioned and with at least two years of experience and having completed the Training approved by the National Board.
- d. Trainers qualified and commissioned.
- e. Commissioners of Area Sections commissioned and fully participating in Trainings and Conventions of Commissioners and Members of Area Committees.

II. Every year, no more than 50 Members «in term of office» are voted from among their active Executives indicated in the lists of the Development Section, of the Trainings Section and the Camp Section and have the above qualifications.

Every District elects 1 to 3 Members from the corresponding lists for a two-years' term. The number of the Members «in term of office» voted by every District is proportional to the total number of the members in good standing of Groups, Executives and members of Area Boards of the specific District.

The District Commissioners, the Chairmen and the Area Sections Commissioners as well as all the eligible for election members as described in article 3 para. 4.I. have a right to vote. A relative quorum and a relative majority is required for the voting. The results are notified to the Secretary General and are validated by the National Board. Details about the procedure of the voting are designated in the SHO's Organisation.

If the voting of the Members «in term of office» cannot be carried out in a District, the Members «in term of office» are designated by the National Board.

The term of office of the Members in this paragraph starts on the day following their election by the Regular or Special National Assembly. The Members «in term of office» are Members of the National Assembly of SHO, if they are active members, and withdraw automatically as soon as they lose such capacity. By exception, Members «in term of office», who during their term of office are voted members of the National Board

become automatically regular Members (upon their election at the National Board).

The Members «in term of office» have, during their term of office, the rights and the duties of the Regular Members of SHO.

III. The Members «in term of office» are voted for two years and may, if they still hold the required qualifications, be elected anew as Members «in term of office» after one year elapses from the expiry of their term.

IV. If for any reason Members «in term of office» have not been voted or do not exist, the National Assembly is considered to meet regularly and its status is not affected from the inexistence or lack of such members.

5. Election of Members due to capacity or «in term of office» as Regular Members: Both, the Members due to capacity and the Members «in term of office» of SHO may be voted as Regular Members anytime, according to the procedure of para. 2 of this article.

6. Rights: The Members (regular, due to capacity, or «in term of office»), when admitted to SHO, have the right to vote and to be voted. However, members that are not in good standing in SHO as specified in the Constitution have no right to participate in the National Assemblies.

7. Resignation: Members of SHO wishing to withdraw, they shall submit their resignation in writing to the National Board of SHO.

8. Member's contribution:

I. All SHO's Members pay an annual contribution specified by the National Assembly.

II. A Member in default of paying the contributions for two consecutive years, though he/she was notified to pay them by the Treasurer during the last two months of the second year, is considered to have resigned from the day of the meeting of the Regular National Assembly of the year following the two-years' period, if he/she has not paid the outstanding contributions up by that day.

Article 4

Striking-off

The National Board may, upon grounded decision, strike off regular Members that have ceased to be interested in SHO and moreover, that have unreasonably not taken part in three consecutive National Assemblies. Also, it may strike off Members, according to the law. A Member that has been stricken off may appeal at the first Regular National Assembly following the striking off against the decision of the National Board on his/her striking-off. That Member may lodge the appeal as per article 88 of the Civil Code against the decision of the National Assembly that validates the striking-off. The lodging of such appeals and the time limit for their exercise has no inhibitory effect.

CHAPTER C

NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

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Article 5

Meeting

- 1. Regular:** The Regular National Assembly meets upon decision of the National Board once a year and in fact, within three months of the expiry of the fiscal year.
- 2. Special:** The Special National Assembly meets upon decision of the National Board or at the request of the one twentieth (1/20) of all the SHO's Members to the Chairman, if the Members submitting the request have fulfilled their financial obligations.

Article 6

Participation & Quorum

- 1. Right to participate:** Only the Members that have fulfilled all their financial obligations to SHO according to the Constitution have the right to participate in the National Assemblies.

2.Quorum: Without prejudice to the provisions of the Law and the Statutes that designates the increased quorum, the assembly is considered to be in quorum if the Members attending and entitled to vote according to the foregoing are more than the one third (1/3) of all the members of SHO.

3. No quorum: If there is no quorum, the Assembly meets on the respective day of the following week, at the same time and in the same place, without further notice. At the adjourned meeting, the Assembly is considered to be in quorum whatever the number of Members present is.

Article 7

Authorities

Besides the other issues according to the Law and the Statutes, the National Assembly has the following authorities: a) approval of the annual report of transactions of the National Board, b) approval of the annual balance sheet, managerial Report and Budget and approval of the annual report of the Auditors' Board, c) discharge of the members of the National Board and the Auditors' Board from any liability, d) election of members of the National Board, as per provisions of article 10, e) election of the members of the Auditors' Board for the starting year, f) election of the members of the Applications Committee and g) discussion and decision-making on any other issue on the agenda.

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Article 8

Panel

Before the discussion of the issues on the agenda, the National Assembly elects from among its attending Members, its Panel, namely the Chairman, two Secretaries and three tellers. The Secretaries prepare the minutes, which are signed by all the Members of the Panel.

Article 9

Procedures

1.Voting: Voting at the National Assembly is by show of hands. If there is an objection to a voting, that voting shall be repeated by roll-call. On personal matters (such as, the election of members of the National Board, matters of trust, disciplinary matters, etc), voting is secret (by ballot papers).

2.Majority: Without prejudice to the provisions of the Law and the Statutes that designate an increased majority, the decisions of the National Assembly are taken by absolute majority of the present Members. In case of election of a person for any office or capacity, only a relative majority is required. In case of tied vote, the voting shall be repeated among those who gathered the same number of votes, if it regards the voting of only one person or the last position.

3.Applications Committee: The National Assembly votes among the SHO's Members five (5) Members, who shall be the Applications Committee, and three (3) substitute Members. The task of the Committee is to participate in the voting of new regular Members of SHO and following the election of the Committee in the Regular or Special National Assembly to decide on the elections, to submit the list of Members proposed as suitable for the National Board and the Applications Committee, the Auditors' Board or for any other Agent, elected from the National Assembly, shall be assigned to it upon decision of the National Assembly and the Committee's operating regulation. Such proposal is not required for the National Assembly. The term of office of the members of the Applications Committee starts upon its election and ends at the next Regular National Assembly. A member of the Applications Committee may not be re-elected as a member of it or of the National Board, unless a year passes from the end of its term of office. The Committee is run based on the regulation authorised by the National Board.

CHAPTER D
NATIONAL BOARD

Article 10

Composition and Term of Office of the NB

1. Composition and election: SHO is run by a twelve-members National Board elected by the National Assembly among its members.

2. Forming in a body: At the first meeting after the election the National Board is formed in a body, electing from among its members the Chairman, the Vice Chairman, the Secretary General, the General Commissioner and the Treasurer.

3. Duration of the Members' term of office: The term of office of the members of the National Board is four years. Every year, the one fourth (1/4) of all the members is renewed. The term of office of the member of the NB starts on the day of the National Assembly at which they are voted and it ends after the election of new members of the NB by the National Assembly held after a four-years' period.

4. Re-voting: The leaving members of the National Board may be re-voted at least one year after the expiry of their term of office.

5. Fill-in of vacancies: The vacancies in members of the National Board for any cause before the end of their term of office may be filled in by the National Assembly. If the vacancies are more than three, they are filled in by the next regular National Assembly. So far, the National Board shall be considered legally composed by the remaining members. If the vacancies remaining after the admission of the substitute members are more than three, a special National Assembly shall be held for their filling-in. So far, the National Board shall be considered legally composed if the remaining members are no less than seven.

6. Duration of the term of office of substitutes: The time of the term of office of every new member voted as in previous paragraph shall be the remaining time of term of office of a member succeeded by the new member. If that time is only a year, then the new member voted to fill in

the vacancy shall be re-voted immediately, by exception of the contents of para. 4.

7. Redistribution of offices: After every renewal of the members of the National Board due to the end of their term of office according to para. 3 or due to a vacancy as per para. 5 as well as after every resignation of any member of the National Board from their office, the National Board shall decide whether to make a new distribution of 2 N.B.' offices as per para. 2.

8. Restrictions: The members of the National Board may not provide SHO with a paid dependent work or make agreements with it that entail pay for the provision of other services or aim at gaining by undertaking a project, a commission or any other provision to SHO.

Article 11

National Board Procedures

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1.Meetings: The National Board meets regularly once a month, upon notice of the Chairman, and especially when it is deemed necessary by the Chairman or at the request of three of its members.

2.Quorum: The National Board is considered to be in quorum when at least seven members are present including the Chairman or the Vice Chairman that substitutes him/her.

3. Voting: The voting at the National Board is by show of hands. On personal matters though (such as, the election of new members of SHO, forming in a body, disciplinary matters, etc), voting is secret (by ballot papers).

4. Majority: For the National Board to make a decision, the members that voted in favour of the proposal should be more than the remaining members present. In case of tied vote, at an open voting, the Chairman shall have two votes, and when the voting is secret, the matter shall be resolved by ballot.

Article 12

Responsibilities of the National Board

The members of the National Board shall not be responsible for the decisions taken at a meeting in which they were not present or if they were present they disagreed and their disagreement is confirmed in the minutes.

Article 13

Powers of the National Board

1. Powers: Besides the other matters regulated by the Law and the Statutes, the National Board shall have the following authorities:

a) to make sure to fulfill the objective of the Greek Guiding Association, b) to run and to manage the affairs and the assets of the Greek Guiding Association in general, c) to establish and to dissolve Area Sections and to appoint and to discharge Area Councils, d) to appoint and to discharge the Greek Guiding Association's Officers e) to appoint and to lay off the personnel but also appoint the special Advisors of the Greek Guiding Association, namely the Legal Counsel, the Technical Advisor, etc, f) to submit to the National Assembly within the first three months of each year a report of transactions, a Balance Sheet and the managerial Report of the year ended as well as the Budget of the year started, and g) without prejudice to the provisions of article 24 para.1, to authorise the Organisation and the By-laws.

2. Delegation of powers: The National Board may delegate some special authorities to the Executive Committee to the Area Councils, to the members of the Area Councils, to other agents of SHO and to its officers.

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Article 14

Executive Committee

1. Composition: The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chairman, the Vice Chairman, the General Secretary, the General Commissioner and the Treasurer of the National Board.

2.Meetings: The Executive Committee shall meet regularly once a fortnight, upon notice of the Chairman, and especially whenever the Chairman deems necessary.

3.Quorum: The Executive Committee shall be in quorum, if there are no less than three members thereat.

4.Substitution of members absent or impeded: If a member of the Executive Committee is absent or impeded to appear in more than three meetings, the National Board shall appoint a temporary substitute from among its members. The substitute of the General Commissioner shall preferably be one of his/her Assistants, provided he/she is a member of the National Board. If the substitute of the General Commissioner is not one of his/her Assistants, the Executive Committee may call one of them to attend the meeting with no right to vote.

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Article 15

Chairman

The Chairman a) prepares together with the General Secretary the agenda of the National Assemblies and the meetings of the National Board and of the Executive Committee, b) runs the meetings of the National Board and of the Executive Committee and puts the issues on voting, c) signs the minutes of the meetings of the National Board and of the Executive Committee, the diplomas of Officers, as well as the remaining records of the Greek Guiding Association, except for those that shall be signed by the National Board, upon recommendation of the Chairman, to another member or other agents of the Greek Guiding Association or Officers thereof, d) signs the orders (warrants) to collect or pay and withdraw monies and securities from Banks, e) makes sure that the Organisation and the By-laws are complied with, f) represents the Greek Guiding Association before all the Courts and all the Judicial and other Authorities, as well as before all the natural or legal entities in relations and transactions of the Greek Guiding Association with them, by signing for the above purpose, any kind of private or notarial contracts, generally

notarial deeds and any record, such as applications, statements, payments, letters of guarantee etc, and g) appoints and revokes attorneys at law.

Article 16

Vice Chairman

If the Chairman is absent or impeded, he/she shall be substituted by the Vice Chairman that shall have the same rights and duties as the Chairman. If the Vice Chairman is inexistent, absent or impeded, he/she shall be substituted by a member of the National Board, appointed by it.

Article 17

General Secretary

1. Powers: The General Secretary a) guides, monitors and verifies the services of the Greek Guiding Association, via his/her Director or the other agents of the Greek Guiding Association or Officers appointed by the National Board, b) makes sure to carry out the correspondence, by signing the outgoing records together with the Chairman, except for the issues assigned by the National Board to other members or agents of the Greek Guiding Association or Officers thereof, c) makes sure to prepare the minutes of the meetings of the National Board and the Executive Committee, by signing them together with the Chairman, d) makes sure to prepare and to submit to the National Board a plan of the annual report of transactions, e) makes sure to keep the books and files, except for those that are assigned by the National Board to other members or agents of the Greek Guiding Association or Officers thereof, f) makes sure to keep the SHO's stamp and g) makes sure to call the National Assembly, the National Board and the Executive Committee.

2.Substitution: If the General Secretary is inexistent, absent or impeded, the National Board shall appoint one from among its members to substitute him/her temporarily.

Article 18

Treasurer

1.Powers: The Treasurer a) is responsible for guiding, monitoring and verifying the general management and safeguarding of SHO's assets, b) makes the collection and the payment from/to any natural or legal entity and based on the related orders (warrants) of the Chairman, by signing the related receipts, c) is responsible in person for the monies in the Treasury, and he/she is required to deposit to account(s) of SHO kept with a Bank(s) selected by the National Board any cash balance beyond the amount defined by the National Board (and in any case beyond the limit provided for by the Law) and is able to undertake based on the related order of the Chairman, the monies and the securities deposited with the Banks, d) makes sure to keep the accounting books and records each time provided for by the Law or additionally determined by the National Board and e) submits to the National Board at the end of every month, a statement that shows the management of the Treasury and at the end of every year, a plan of the annual Balance Sheet and the annual management Report of the year ended and the Budget plant of the next year.

2.Substitution: If the Treasurer is inexistent, absent or impeded, the National Board appoints one from among its member to substitute him/her temporarily.

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Article 19

General Commissioner

1.Powers: The General Commissioner: a) is the head of all the Officers of SHO, and runs and supervises its technical and disciplinary procedures and b) has the general supervision where there are Greek Guides and has the special rights provided by the Organisation.

2.Substitution: If the General Commissioner is inexistent, absent or impeded, the National Board appoints one from among its member (preferably an Assistant of the General Commissioner) to substitute him/her temporarily.

Article 20

International Commissioner

The International Commissioner is voted by the National Board from among its Members. His/her main duty is to communicate with the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS), the World Bureau and the European Committee of WAGGGS, to enhance the subsistence of Guiding within the National Organisation and to promote the Greek Guiding abroad, to communicate with the International Organisations as well as with international and foreign non-governmental Organisations.

Article 21

Central Administration Sections

- 1. Establishment & Management:** Depending on the needs, the National Board may establish Administration Sections with specific powers, the Chairmen/Commissioners of which are voted by the National Board.
- 2. Decisions:** The decisions of the Administration Sections are submitted for approval by the Executive Committee.

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CHAPTER E

FINANCIAL ISSUES

Article 22

Audit Committee

- 1. Election & mission:** The National Assembly elects among its members a two-member Audit Committee (with two substitutes) to audit the financial management of the Greek Guiding Association, namely the income, their source, the expenditure, etc. The National Assembly, besides the Auditors' Board, may also, if it wishes so, appoint upon proposal of the NB certified professionals - external auditors to audit specific financial periods or activities.

2.Powers: The Executive Committee is entitled to take knowledge of the accounting books and any other record necessary for the execution of its work. The term of office of the members of the Auditors' Board and of their substitutes is annual, and they may be re-elected at those posts for up to three (3) consecutive terms of office. Upon expiry of one year of the termination of any third consecutive term of office, a member of the National Assembly may be elected anew for the Auditors' Board. Members of the NB, whose term of office has expired, may not be elected as members of the Auditors' Board prior to the expiry of two (1) years as of their term of office termination.

3.Report of audit: The Audit Committee prepares a report on the audit conducted and presented to the National Assembly. Any external auditors may also prepare a respective Report, which may be presented at the National Assembly too.

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Article 23

Resources and Assets

1.Separation of resources: The resources of SHO are separated into regular and special.

2.Regular resources: Regular resources are the contributions of the members, the collections of any kind from the operation of the various Sections and generally, from the events and activities of the Greek Guiding Association as well as the income from its assets.

The contribution amount of the members of the Guiding and the period for which the contribution is paid are defined by general decisions of the National Board.

3.To serve its objectives and to get the necessary material means, the association may, by decision of the National Board, establish and/or participate in non-profit civil companies as well as trade companies the activities of which are similar to its purposes or support its purposes.

The participation of the Association as a general partnership in personal companies is not allowed. In all the above companies, the Association may not transfer its assets that possesses.

Furthermore, the Association, in particular, in order to achieve its statutory purpose and to enhance the means for achieving them, in accordance with article 2 of the Statutes, may develop activities and provide services that facilitate or financially support the execution of its educational and creative programs, including but not limited to the following: A. services of national and patriotic associations, B. services of camping sites and facilities whether for tents and recreational vehicles (caravans) or not, C. rental and management services of privately owned or leased real estate, D. production of electricity from photovoltaic systems or other systems of renewable and eco-friendly energy sources, E. education services and organization of training seminars, F. other social welfare services with provision of accommodation for adults, children and young people, G. In particular, and with the purpose of finding resources for its activities, the Association may organize events, bazaars, as well as operate a Store for the sale and marketing of the mentioned items with or without the logo and marks of SHO, including but not limited to, clothing and footwear, sports equipment and camping equipment, leather goods and travel goods, textile goods, household goods, hardware, hand tools, construction materials, electrical household appliances, furniture, lighting and other household goods, books, newspapers and stationery, music and video recordings, games of all kinds, pharmaceuticals, cosmetics and toiletries, watches and jewelry and other retail items available from non-specialized stores, H. The sale and marketing of all the above items can also be done through mail order or online sales (e-shop), I. other activities and services as appropriate.

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More specific Regulations to be approved by the National Board of SHO in accordance with the Statutes may further specify the above activities and services provided, as well as the items that shall be available from the central station or the local branches of SHO.

4.Special resources: Special resources are the special contributions, the donations, the grants, the inheritances, the bequests and generally, any other revenue.

5.Distribution of assets: The Greek Guiding Association's assets may not be distributed for purposes other than those provided for in the Constitution

CHAPTER F FINAL PROVISIONS

Article 24

Special Organisation and By-laws

1.Approval: Issues that refer exclusively to the internal procedures of SHO are regulated with By-laws approved by the National Assembly, provided such approval is required by the Law. As for the rest, the details of execution of the Constitution and generally, the details of organisation and operation of the Greek Guiding Association and its Services are regulated by a Special Organisation and By-laws approved by the National Board.

2.Submission: A copy of the By-laws approved by the National Assembly according to the previous paragraph are submitted without delay to the proper Public Authority or the Athens Court having the jurisdiction, according to the Law.

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Article 25

Stamp

1. The Association has a round stamp where the name of the "Greek Guiding Association" and the year of establishment 1932 is inscribed in the circumference at the bottom of the circle, and the official emblem of the Association (a clover with a regenerating palm tree in the center and a star on each of the three leaves of the clover and with the inscription "Aien aristevein" ("Always excel") on a ribbon below the palm tree) is depicted in the center.

2. The Association may use, in all kinds of printed and electronic means of communication and promotion, other characteristic marks, logos,

features, artistic depictions, etc. that have been previously approved by the National Board.

Article 26

Dissolution

1.Decision to dissolve: Save the cases provided for by the law, the Greek Guiding Association shall be dissolved by decision of the Special National Assembly held especially for this purpose. To make a decision, the Members duly present should be more than the ones absent and the three fourths (3/4) of the Members that are duly present should vote for the dissolution according to the foregoing.

2.Liquidation and distribution of assets: The Meeting votes at the same time a five-members Committee to liquidate the SHO's assets, which is distributed, according to the decision on the dissolution of the National Assembly, for another Association that serves a similar purpose.

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Article 27

Amendment of the Statutes

These Statutes may be amended, save the first and the second article, by decision of the Special National Assembly which is especially held for this reason. To make a decision, the Members duly present should be more than the absent ones and the three fourths (3/4) of the Members duly present should vote according to the foregoing.

TRANSITIONAL PROVISION

The provisions of articles 5 and 6 apply since the National Assembly of 2009.

At the Regular National Assembly in 2009, the five (5) members that complete a three-years' term from their election (2006) shall withdraw from the National Board and they shall be replaced by five (5) new members. From the five new members, the first three (3) shall be elected for a four-years' term and the other two (2) for a three-years' term.

At the Regular National Assembly in 2010, the five (5) members that complete a three-years' term from their election (2007) shall withdraw the National Board and they shall be replaced by four (4) new members. From the four new members, the first three (3) shall be elected for a four-years' term and the fourth member for a two-years' term. After the National Assembly, the National Board shall consist of fourteen members.

At the Regular National Assembly in 2011, the five (5) members that complete a three-years' term from their election (2008) shall withdraw from the National Board and they shall be replaced by three (3) new members of a four-years' term. After the National Assembly, the National Board shall consist of twelve members.

At the Regular National Assembly in 2012, three members shall withdraw from the National Board (the two members elected in 2009 for a three-years' term and the one (1) member that elected in 2010 for a two-years' term) and they shall be replaced by three (3) new members for a four-years' term.

By exception of article 5, the members withdrawing from the National Board upon completion of their first three-years' term at the National Assemblies of 2009, 2010 and 2011 shall be forthwith eligible for re-election.

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CODIFICATION

These Statutes are a codification of the Statutes of the Association originally called «Girl Guides Association», which was initially authorised by the Decision no. 2949/5.4.1934 of the First Instance Court of Athens and it was entered in the books of Associations of the same Court under the number 3674/15.4.1934. Then, the association was dissolved by the decision no. 73434/11.10.1939 of the Minister of Religion Affairs and National Education, which was issued in application of the E.L. 1798/1939. (It is mentioned that the N.B. by its decision dated 10.6.1939 had already decided to dissolve the association). The association was re-established and its new Constitution was authorised by
